Senior Master Patrolman Kenosha Police Department - Erich Weidner
Erich is a master patrolman in the KPD Tavern Unit. He is also an advanced
Training instructor and law enforcement academy instructor at GT College. Officer
Erich Weidner has 25(+) years of Law Enforcement experience. For the past 20 years
he has been involved in the enforcement of alcohol and tobacco laws. This
enforcement includes inspections at licensed businesses, enforcing laws at licensed
businesses, criminal investigations at licensed establishments, and administering
underage decoys programs. Officer Erich Weidner has trained over 200 Officers in
the state of Wisconsin on these topics. He is currently sponsored by Molson Coors
