Erich is a master patrolman in the KPD Tavern Unit. He is also an advanced

Sheriff's Office / Commander - Brown — Outagamie Bomb Squad
With the increasing trend and threat of active attacks in America's communities, it
is important for law enforcement, first responders, security professionals, and
crime prevention specialists to be able to identify potential explosives or evidence
of their construction. When responding to a scene, knowledge of components and
chemicals used could assist you in identifying evidence of explosive manufacturing
that may have been otherwise overlooked. Lt. Jansen, Commander of the Brown —
Outagamie Bomb Squad, will cover the construction and classification of IEDs,
including their function, components, classifications, and how they are
constructed, as well as identify common precursor chemicals and materials used to
make homemade explosives and how they are used in an attack. Lt. Jansen will be
presenting in-person two back-to-back CISA courses - IED Construction and
Classification, as well as HME and Precursor Awareness. Successful completion of
these courses also qualifies the participants for a certificate. To obtain the
